Official opening of CBHB program

KidsCare Community Based Homecare and Bee Keeping Program (CBHB) is already operating in 18 villages. The Deputy County Commissioner, KidsCare volunteers (KCV's) together with LungaLunga Sub-County officers from departments of Livestock, Social Services and Trade, marketing and cooperative officially opened the program. The first bee-keeping demonstration unit was launched. The KCV' s were also motivated to take up the leadership role and work cooperatively within their own groups. It is really time to make the next steps with the County Government and other partners.

Registration of the first 6 bee keepers' group as a social welfare group is completed. For the group to perform it was necessary form them to register under the Ministry of East African community, Labour and Social Protection. KidsCare scholarship program is making progress. 33 children from our homecare program are sponsored to various institutions within the Sub-County. This year, 3 girls completed their secondary education while one boy completed Grade -I in motor vehicle engineering. KidsCare family value these youngsters as role-models in the community.

The farm harvested a large amount of melons and maize this year where we have been selling to local customers and also supply fresh farm produce to the facility department for restaurant and catering services.

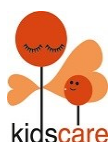
Coming Soon....
